Special Events Medical Services (SEMS) provides field trauma support and works within the parameters of the Maryland Institute for Emergency Medical Services Systems (MIEMSS). Note: SEMS utilizes Gator vehicles specifically modified for field trauma use. A team of qualified physicians is present to supervise medical activities and to perform examinations following a fall.

Western Run Plate is run between blue and white flags.

Attention Horsemen: Trainers are NO LONGER required to report horses on the grounds, if they are running. All scratches must be made no later than one hour prior to post time for the first race. Foal papers and any other material for horse identification purposes are to be turned in to the Horse Identifier.

The Grand National course was inspected by Chairman Peter Fenwick on Monday, April 5, 2010.

Turf: Turf is even throughout the majority of the course. Winter snows significantly diminished the goose and deer activity. There are several areas of ground ivy in open area between fences six and seven and eight and nine of main course.

Smoothness: Winter snows also have had a protective effect on the smoothness of the course. The majority of the course has been cultipactor rolled on 4/2/10, excluding soft areas between five and six and twelve and thirteen of main course. These remaining areas will be rolled within next several days, following a five day 85 degree weather spell.

Compaction: Lange Pentrometer readings between 55 and 110. Exceptions were in the soft areas. This is typical of this time of year and will tighten quickly as warm days have their effect.

Moisture: Readings were between 8 and 10+ throughout. Some areas have dried at the surface, but there is considerable water in the ground. The forecast is for mostly dry and warm days in the days from now to race date.

Notes: As mentioned above, the winter weather had some unanticipated benefits. There is significant moisture in the ground, grass is as green as it has ever been on 4/5/10 and very thick. Smoothness is good and responding well to roller.
