THE STEWARDS WILL BE MONITORING THE SITUATION CLOSELY. POST TIME FOR THE FIRST RACE IS 12:30 P.M. WITH PADDOCK TIME OF 12:05 P.M.

All post race testing will be done in two stalls of the four stall barn between Barn B (Sheppard) and the Block Barn. The designated stalls face the Block Barn. Please be advised that horsemen will need to make necessary arrangements for buckets and equipment to cool their horses out in this area if being tested. No horse will be allowed to go back to any other barns: A, C, D, E until completion of testing.

Attention Horsemen: Trainers are NO LONGER required to report horses on the grounds, if they are running. All scratches must be made no later than one hour prior to post time for the first race. Foal papers and any other material for horse identification purposes are to be turned in to the Horse Identifier.

All jockeys are reminded to check-in with the Clerk of Scales one hour prior to post time of the first race and report his/her engagement(s) and overweight, if any. There will be a Jockeys Meeting at 11:35 a.m. ALL RIDERS MUST ATTEND.

Attention Horsemen: There will be no schooling or training on the racecourse or around the outside of the racecourse. The committee thanks all horsemen for their cooperation. Please adhere to all training signs posted at the gaps going to the schooling field.

**NSA Shoe Policy**

No raised toes, front or rear, will be permitted in any race. A raised toe is defined as an extension of the shoe by more than 1/16 of an inch. Stickers, caulks and turndowns are not permitted. Block heels are permitted, however the toe may not exceed 1/16 of an inch.

The Springdale Race Course was inspected on November 1, 2010 by Jeff Teter.

**Turf:** The turf consists of dormant Bermuda grass about six inches in height. The course was drill seeded with rye grass in mid-September. Germination was good, but with dry conditions in September and October, growth has been sporadic.

**Smoothness:** The course is smooth to walk on. The course was aerated and Cambridge rolled twice during the summer.

**Compaction:** Compaction ranges from 90 to 110 (good) throughout the course.

**Moisture:** The moisture meter reads dry. We had 2.25 inches of rain the week of October 25. They are calling for rain this Wednesday and Thursday. It has been very dry since August 1. We have only had 5.45 inches of rain in that time from two storms.

**Course Update as of November 8:** The course received 1" of rain last Wednesday/Thursday. No rain is in the forecast this week. Saturday Weather: Partly Cloudy, 69 degrees.

### Directions:

From the North: I-95 South to I-20 West. Take Exit 98 and turn right off exit ramp onto US 521.

Follow 521 (Broad Street) through town and turn left onto Knights Hill Road. Race course is about 1 mile on right.

From the South: I-20 East to Exit 92 (Lugoff/Camden). Turn right off ramp and follow Route 601 North. Merge right onto Route 1 North and follow through Lugoff over the Wateree River Bridge. Turn left onto Springdale Drive, at the new stop light turn right onto Knights Hill Road. Race course will be on the left.



## **Carolina Cup Racing Association Horsemen's Badges and Luncheon Tent Wrist Bands**

1. NSA pins are considered a general admission ticket. The NSA pin will allow access to the paddock, but will not allow access to the grandstand or the luncheon tent. NSA parking tags allow access to the Stable or Horsemen gates only.
2. Participating horsemen may pick up their credential envelopes in the Carolina Cup office until 5:00 pm Friday, November 12, the day prior to the races. If you will not be arriving until race day, please call Teri Leigh Teed, Assistant Director, at the office (803) 432 -6513 to make other arrangements for picking up credentials.
3. Participating horsemen will receive 2 badges, 2 luncheon tent wristbands, and 1 parking credential in an envelope. Participating horsemen may receive up to 4 badges and 4 wristbands without charge. If more than 2 are needed, please call Teri Leigh Teed at the office, in advance, so the proper numbers may be ready upon arrival.
4. Every person on the grounds must have an admission credential and every vehicle must have a parking tag. Please make arrangements with Teri Leigh Teed at the office as to how many stable personnel credentials and extra vehicle credentials are needed, in advance, so the proper number may be ready upon arrival.
5. Participating horsemen may purchase horsemen badges or wristbands beyond the 4 provided.
6. Non-participating horsemen must purchase badges and or wristbands to be allowed access to the grandstand and luncheon tent.
7. Pricing:
  - Horsemen Badge:** Allows access to the paddock and grandstand but not the luncheon tent = \$35
  - Wristband:** Allows access to the luncheon tent only = \$50
  - Horsemen Badge and Wristband:** Allows access to the paddock, grandstand and luncheon tent = \$75
