All jockeys are reminded to check-in with the Clerk of Scales one hour prior to post time of the first race and report his/her engagement(s) and overweight, if any. There will be a Jockeys Meeting at 12:15 p.m. ALL RIDERS MUST ATTEND.

Attention Horsemen: Trainers are NO LONGER required to report horses on the grounds, if they are running. All scratches must be made no later than one hour prior to post time for the first race. Foal papers and any other material for horse identification purposes are to be turned in to the Horse Identifier.

The Charleston course was inspected by NSA Safety Advisor Barry Watson on Monday, October 24.

Course: There are a few areas of concern that will need attention before the running of the first Charleston Races in eight years. There are a number of fire ant hills that will be treated. There are a number of small furrowed holes on the far turn that will be filled. Root systems from trees along the outside rail of the far turn have grown 24 feet onto the outside of the far turn in several areas. This will compromise navigation through this area and make the approach to the turn for home more deliberate. The hurdle that was placed in the middle of the far turn will be removed to improve passage through this narrow area. Horses will jump 11 fences over the two and one quarter mile distance. The bottom 12 to 15 feet of the small grove of trees on the far turn should be pruned to improve line of sight.

Turf: The turf on this course consists predominately of dormant Bermuda, remnants of Bahia, and an assortment of other native grasses and weeds that averaged four inches of "real" height at the time of this inspection. There are number of small, thin, patchy areas on the course that should be no cause for concern.

Smoothness: This course has been aerated twice since the summer. With the exception of aforementioned conditions, the remainder of this course was relatively smooth throughout.

Compaction: Race course, 100-130 (Good to Firm). Most readings taken were around 110-120 (Good). Road crossings were fractionally more firm.

Moisture: 2-6 (Dry to Average).

Driving Directions:

From I-95, exit onto I-26 E toward Charleston, then I-526 toward Savannah (exit 212). At end exit to right onto Hwy 17S, go approx 6 miles and cross over overpass over RR tracks, then come to stop light at Burger King (Main Road), continue straight for 2 ½ miles, then fork left at blinking light onto Hwy 162, immediately cross RR tracks then go 2 miles and turn left into Plantation at Stono Ferry. Before this left turn you will see two white PVC fences and golf course, then gate to community. Follow signs to Amenity Field once inside. Semi trailers proceed with caution as there are low hanging branches. Arrivals after 6 pm Saturday will be let in by security and led to stabling.
