## THIRD PARTY FUROSEMIDE (SALIX) ADMINISTRATION

Horsemen are reminded that third party administration of furosemide (Salix) is in effect at this race meet. Please refer to the 2019 NSA Spring Condition Book (center pink section) for complete details of the new NSA Medication policy. Contact Dr. Jeff Witwer for questions (803-243-0328)

Foal papers are not required to be on file with the Horse Identifier at the races providing the horse can be properly identified; and tattoo and/or microchip is required for all horses, with a one-time exception providing the horse can be identified by its markings. All scratches must be made no later than one hour prior to post time for the first race.

A pre-race veterinary exam is required of each entry beginning at 1:30 p.m. at the stable area by Drs. Rachel Westerlund and Cooper Williams. Bandages are not permitted during the examination. ALL HORSES NOT ON LASIX MUST BE ON THE GROUNDS 2 HOURS PRIOR TO POST TIME FOR THE FIRST RACE FOR THE PRE-RACE VET CHECK UNLESS EXCUSED BY THE STEWARDS FOR EXTENUATING CIRCUMSTANCES. LASIX HORSES MUST BE ON THE GROUNDS 4 HOURS PRIOR TO POST TIME FOR THEIR SCHEDULED RACE.

Scratches are due no later than 2:15 p.m. with the Clerk of Scales, Jake Chalfin.

There will be a mandatory meeting of apprentice jockeys at 2:00 p.m. at the Stewards Stand.

There will be a mandatory jockeys meeting at 2:15 p.m. with the Stewards at the jockeys tent. An Officials meeting will be held immediately following the jockeys' meeting in the paddock.

Update: The Grand National race course was inspected on April 15, 2019 by Peter Fenwick.

Turf: The turf is in good condition throughout with the exception of the area around the GN 12th and GN 14th. These areas are thinner than usual, but are filling in. The entire course has been mowed.

Smoothness: The entire course has been Cambridge rolled and harrowed and is the smoothness of fair hunting country.

Compaction: Compaction readings range from 70-120 (yielding to good).

Moisture: Readings range from 6 (average) in the higher areas to solid 10 (wet) in the lower areas. The course received approximately an inch of rain Sunday evening, but is under high winds on Monday, and sun for the next several days is predicted. There are two areas of noted concern following many months of extreme rainfall. The area several strides after the second fence of the Grand National has developed a spring. The area is being monitored and slowly drying, and some form of go around is considered. Similarly, the area after the Grand National 4th has developed a spring and modification is considered. The second last of the Western Run Plate is also affected by this latter spring with modification considered. Final decisions regarding the above concerns to be made by week's end and will be communicated in the notices.
