Race I

#1 CITE fell at the last fence. He appeared to knuckle upon landing. Jockey Willie McCarthy was examined by the course physician and cleared to ride.

#4 RENOWN chipped in and twisted and lost his rider at the sixth fence. Jockey Jack Doyle was examined by the course physician and cleared to ride.

#5 REPEAT REPEAT was randomly selected by the stewards for pre-race testing.

Race II

#1 ORCHESTRA LEADER fell at the last fence when his rider saw a bad spot and he hit the top of the fence and fell while making a strong move. Jockey Keri Brion was examined by the course physician and not cleared to ride (wrist injury).

#2 ALL FOR US pulled up lame before the 7th fence and was vanned off.

Race IV

#6 AMNICALOLA was pulled up before the third last fence tired.

Jockey Aaron Sinnott was observed by the stewards using an excessive amount of stick on the winner #2 WIGWAM BABY during the running of this race. The Stewards were able to count fifteen strikes from the second last fence to the wire, many in succession without giving the horse time to respond. The stewards met with Jockey Sinnott outside the jockey tent after the last race and gave him a warning that this was not acceptable and must be considerably modified or he would be subject to penalty next time. Jockey Sinnott was very polite and promised to be careful next time.

Race V

#10 INVIGORATING ran as a first time Lasix horse as his trainers stated that he had entered him on Lasix.

#10 INVIGORATING pulled up before the third last tired.

Race VI

#3 SATISH twisted over the first jump and lost rider Aaron Sinnott who was examined by the course physician and not cleared to ride as he sustained a concussion.

ADDITIONAL COMMENTS:

Tennessee Equine Veterinarians did an excellent job of examining the horses both pre and post-race. All fallers and horses that pulled up were examined and cleared to ship home.
